



Dead Centre Bowhunters Camping Policy

Purpose

To ensure campers have a safe, memorable and enjoyable experience.

To inform campers that the area they are occupying is situated on a government reserve.

To insure campers abide by the rules set out and be mindful of fellow campers.

To protect native vegetation and native wild life.

To insure noise is kept to an acceptable medium.

To minimise dust by enforcing speed limitations.

Information

The area that you are occupying is situated on a government reserve, therefore all wildlife and fauna is protected under Northern Territory Parks and Wildlife Conservation Act.

To the East of the complex/campground there is boundary fence with locked gates. Beyond this fence is out of bounds as it encroaches into a pistol shooting over fire range and is cordoned off by Northern Territory Police.

If planning to take a hike around our complex/ranges, it is advisable to let one of the staff know your intentions. Wear appropriate clothing/footwear/headwear and take plenty of water.

Water from the yellow storage tank is used for showering and washing purposes. Drinking water can be accessed from the grey rain water tank situated on the western end of club facility.

The distance from facility to the centre of town is 17km and the trip should take approximately 20 minutes.

Campground Rules

Strictly **NO** fires are allowed anywhere within the complex surrounds.

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas.

No animals to be brought onto the facility unless prior approval is obtained either from club president, or if an ABA sanctioned activity, the ABA national executive.

Noise is to be kept to a minimum with the likes of generators being activated between the hours of 0600 (6am) through to 2200hrs (10pm)

To assist dust suppressant speed signs are to be strictly observed.

Do not feed native wildlife.

Do not throw food scraps into bushland or around camp ground/facility.

All food scraps are to be wrapped in paper/plastic etc. and placed into waste disposal bins provided.

Adverse behaviour will not be tolerated.

Language calculated to offend will not be tolerated.

Facilities are to be left clean and tidy at all times.

Further information can be obtained from any of the friendly staff/members of the club.
